

Setting The Agenda

- Call the Conversation
- Choose your time and Space
 - In person = physical space
 - Zoom = labeled breakout rooms
- Negotiate Convergence
 - i.e. two callers can decide if their topics can be combined







Roles in Open Space format

- Caller: Announces a conversation, hosts, & summarizes results
- Participant: join conversation, listen, and share the air
- Law of Mobility: If you find yourself in a situation where you are not contributing or learning, move somewhere you can.

Mobility on Zoom: Move to another breakout room on your own OR return to the main room and the host will help you.



Tips for Callers (the people leading the topic)

- Introductions
- Encourage everyone to participate and "share the air"
- Move to closure and capture key ideas 10 min. before session ends
- If group wants to continue discussion, find a place and time for that to happen




Cafe' Etiquette = Following our ground rules

- Be purposeful and to the point.
- Connect ideas and share relevant information.
- Allow everyone the chance to talk.

Principles of Open Space

- Whoever comes are the right people
- Whenever it starts is the right time
- Whatever happens is the only thing that could happen
- Whenever it is over, it is over
